Mandatory insurance that exchange students are required to purchase.	<p>National Health Insurance: 2,000 – 3,000 JPY per month (depends on the city) Covers 70% of medical bills</p> <p><u>Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS)</u> 1,000 JPY per year. Osaka University students are required to purchase PAS.</p>
Strongly recommended insurance to purchase	Overseas traveller's personal accident insurance and Liability insurance covering the period from your departure until your return home.
