Passport/Visa	Exchange students are required to visit their local Israeli Consulate or Embassy of Israel prior to
Requirements	their arrival to obtain a student visa.
	The student visa is an A2 visa – a multiple-entry student visa (making it possible to leave Israel
	for a vacation and return without requiring a new visa). The visa is valid for up to one year.  Recipients of this visa are not permitted to work in Israel.
	It is mandatory that all students participating in programs of one semester or longer secure a
	Student Visa (A-2) before arriving in Israel.
