Courses are mainly Public International Law, International Business Law and European Law courses. Course information for the following academic year will be updated in early August. Many courses offered during the current academic year will be offered during the following academic year as well. <p>Undergraduate/graduate courses</p>	<p>Exchange students may choose of all law courses listed in the WebOodi system providing that they have the background information required for a course (except for a few master's courses indicated in WebOodi): https://weboodi.helsinki.fi/hy/</p> <p>Exchange students may also take courses from other faculties providing that their home university and the other faculty agree with this. Majority of the courses should be law courses.</p>
<p>Grading and credits</p>	<p>The Finnish grading scale 5-0 is comparable to ECTS grades A-F. More information about grading: http://www.helsinki.fi/law/studies/general/credits_grading.html It is required that incoming exchange students complete at least 20 ECTS credits/semester.</p>
<p>Completing courses and assessment of learning</p>	<p>Courses can be completed with different kind of exams, essays, learning diaries, oral presentations etc. There are no exam periods, but exams take place usually during the last lecture of each course. One re-sit is arranged for each course. Exams are written exams. Exams can take place between teaching periods. Mere attendance gives no credits.
