## Language

The language of instruction at the University of Ljubljana is predominantly Slovene. The Faculty of Law also offers courses for exchange students in English.

Exchange students are offered an Erasmus Intensive Slovene language course before starting the winter or summer semester.

## Accommodation

The University of Ljubljana's International Office will try to help you find suitable accommodation for the period of your stay in Ljubljana. There are two possibilities: private accommodation and student dormitories.

All rooms in student dormitories are double rooms. Rooms are given to students on a "first come first serve" basis. Internet access is available.

## Cost of living

You will need approximately EUR 450 a month to cover all your basic living costs. Exactly how much you spend will depend on your lifestyle, but this figure takes into account all costs including accommodation, food, public transport, and books.

## Currency

The official currency in Slovenia is the euro.



## THE UNIVERSITY OF LJUBLJANA

The University of Ljubljana is an institution with a rich tradition. With its nearly 50,000 undergraduate and graduate students participating in over 300 undergraduate and graduate programs, it ranks among the largest universities in Europe. A total of 23 faculties and 3 art academies employ approximately 6,000 full-time university teachers, researchers and administrative staff.

The University of Ljubljana was established in 1919 and has its seat in the capital of Slovenia. Students account for almost 20% of the population of Ljubljana, giving the city a youthful and lively character.

The University is located in the centre of Ljubljana, where the central university building and the majority of its departments are located.

## FACULTY OF LAW IN BRIEF



The Faculty of Law in Ljubljana is the oldest and the largest law faculty in Slovenia. It offers its students an intellectually exciting learning environment with high academic standards. The faculty promotes both legal knowledge and critical thouaht.

The Faculty of Law is housed in a renovated facility and provides a distinguished and creative academic setting.

In the 2009/10 academic year the Faculty introduced the three-cycle degree system. The Bachelor of Law level constitutes the first four years of law studies. At the master's and doctoral levels there are several different degree programs:

## Library

The Faculty of Law library dates back to 1920. Today, it is a modern university library open to the public. The entire library collection encompasses more than 130,000 items. Materials published after 1980 are freely available, whereas older materials are carefully archived. The library subscribes to more than 300 international and Slovene periodicals and provides access to a variety of electronic databases



# COURSES FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS



Altogether there are about 2,500 students at the Faculty of Law. Every year almost 500 new students begin their law studies at the Faculty. Annually the Faculty receives about 70-80 exchange students, who spend one or two semesters in Ljubliana, through the Erasmus, Erasmus Mundus, and CEEPUS programs and bilateral exchange agreements.

In order to attract a high number of foreign students and further strengthen its international ties, the Faculty of Law in Liubliana has introduced courses especially designed for exchange students. The faculty offers 19 such courses that are given either in the winter or summer semester. These courses are conducted in English.
