English Language Requirements	All students studying at the University of Sheffield not from a majority English speaking country are required to provide evidence of their English language proficiency in their application. This includes students who will be studying for a single semester. Students will need to meet the departmental requirements. Module Choice Information

Module choice information will be emailed out to students with a link to online form to make their provisional choices.

- Incoming Law students are only permitted to take LAW modules within the School of Law (except for English Language modules run by the ELTC.)
- Students are required to study 60 Sheffield Credits (30 ECTS Credits) per semester.
- Students may be allowed to register for a minimum of 40 Sheffield Credits (20 ECTS Credits) for one semester, or 100 Sheffield Credits for students studying with us for the full year (50 ECTS Credits.)
- The student's home university must provide written authorisation for this, which must be uploaded to the application form.
- Students taking more than 60 UoS credits per semester will incur a charge for the additional credits.

Choosing Postgraduate Modules:

Postgraduate modules are only suitable for students who have already completed 3 years or more of law study and whose level of English is fluent. This must be evidenced by providing transcripts to date and written approval from the Home University.

Please note that students who take postgraduate modules will not receive their results until April/May for Semester 1, and late July for Semester 2.

Extending your stay

If a student comes to Sheffield for the Autumn semester only and then decides they wish to extend their stay to the full year, they must apply to Global Opportunities & Exchanges copying in law-seo@sheffield.ac.uk by **31 October 2023.**

We will assess the current balance of students for inbound and outbound students and will let them know. Extensions are not automatically granted and cannot be granted by the Law school.

Students would need to apply for a Student Visa for the Spring semester if they chose to extend their exchange in Sheffield. Students will not be allowed to extend their stay if they apply after **31 October 2023.**

Application Process	 Students must be nominated by the home university via our on-line form* (Information will be sent via email when nominations are open) If the nomination is in line with our exchange agreement, the students then receive a link to the on-line application form. * Once students are accepted, they receive an email confirmation containing their applicant number. The applicant number allows students to apply for University accommodation. * Note that our application process is electronic. We do not accept paper applications.
Housing Information	Students can apply online for University-owned accommodation once they have received their applicant number.
