

ACCOMMODATION

Which modules can I choose?

First, check the exchange partnership that your Home University has with the University of Westminster. This will tell you from which College/Schools/subject areas you can choose. You can find <u>a list of our Exchange Partners with this information</u> here

- You cannot mix modules from different Schools. If you are nominated for Westminster Business School, for example, you must select modules from within that School
- You can find our <u>Module Catalogues here</u>
- You are allowed to take a maximum of 3 modules per semester, up to 60 UK credits
- A portfolio of work will likely be required for practical Arts, Media Communication and Architecture modules. Have a look at our <u>Portfolio requirements page</u>

University Halls of Residence

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

ACADEMIC

Undergraduate

- If you are a student from a country using the of your application
 Grade Point Average (GPA) system, you must application
 have a cumulative GPA of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale. If you wish to study subjects from the School of Arts and the School
 - of Media & Communication, we require a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- If you are from a country with a different grading system, you must have an average of a C grade, or good, or equivalent. If you wish to study subjects from the School of Arts and the School of Media & Communication, you must have an average of a B grade, or very good, or equivalent

Postgraduate

• GPA as for undergraduate, but you must be a graduate and hold an undergraduate degree

PROOF OF ENGLISH

Language of Instruction at the University of Westminster is English

- For modules within the **School of Arts and the School of Media & Communication**, a minimum score of IELTS 6.5 (or equivalent) is required, with a minimum of 6.0 in each element
- For modules within all other schools, an overall score of IELTS 6.0 (or equivalent) is required, with a minimum of 5.5 in each element
- Students who have been nominated by our exchange partners are able to provide evidence of English language ability in the form of a **formal letter** of reference from their Home University, outlining their language ability. Please discuss this with your home exchange/study abroad office
- If you are not able to provide a formal letter of reference from your home university, proof of English must be in the form of a recent test (usually from within the last 2 years). Some tests that we accept are: IELTS Academic, IELTS for UKVI, Pearson, TOEFL (iBT), Duolingo and Cambridge Assessment English (C1 Advanced CAE / C2 Proficiency CPE). <u>A list of additional tests</u> can be found here
- Please note, we are not able to accept scores from across more than one test

Grade release

Results are published in line with the <u>University Calendar</u>

Semester 1 students: late February Semester 2 and Full Year students: late June

Transcripts

Students will have access to secure, validated electronic transcripts. For students who do not hold any referrals/deferrals, transcripts are usually first released via the <u>University of Westminster Verification</u> <u>Service Portal</u> approximately 10 days after the grade release date

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Will I need a visa?


If you will be studying with us for **less** than six months, you will require a <u>Standard Visitor visa</u>

If you will be studying with us for **more** than six months, you will require a <u>Student visa</u>

Full, tailored information and guidance will be – sent to applicants following acceptance onto the programme

HOW TO APPLY



STEP 1

You must first be nominated by your Home University

Your Home University should contact us with your name and information in line with our nomination deadlines

NOMINATION DEADLINES

Start date: September Nomination deadline: 1 April

Start date: January Nomination deadline: 1 September

STEP 2

We will contact all nominated students by email, inviting them to complete our online application form

You will select your housing and module preferences as part of the application form

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Start date: September Application deadline: 1 May

Start date: January Application deadline: 15 October

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

- Academic transcript (showing all years of study and grade average)
- Copy of passport (main photo page)
- Proof of English language ability (if required)
- Portfolio of work (if required)

OUTCOME

You will receive an official acceptance email once your online application has been processed and approved



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
